About Rick Osborne

At 14 years of age, Rick was a drug addict; at 16 a street gang member; at 17 an outlaw biker; and at 21 a federal convict. Rick spent 24 years of his life in prison and, at age 46, left prison for the last time. This is a fantastic opportunity to meet someone who has been there, done that and lived to share his story.

Now in its fifth year, **In The Mind's Eye** is a unique film and forum series that focuses on substance use and addiction and will feature 15 FREE events throughout November in Waterloo Region. Film and forum topics will include preventing substance use among youth; overdose training; and housing issues.
